A BILL INTITULED

An Act to enable the Corporation of the City of Auckland to take, Title. divert, and impound the Whole of the Water flowing into and in the Head-waters of the Streams called the Nihotupu, Huia, and Waitakerei, and all or any of the Tributaries of such Headwaters, for the Purpose of increasing the Supply of Water for the Inhabitants of the said City and for other Purposes in connection with the said Objects.

WHEREAS it is expedient to enable the Corporation of the City of Preamble. 10 Auckland to take, divert, and impound the whole of the waters flowing into and in the head-waters of the said streams called the Nihotupu, Huia, and Waitakerei, and all or any of the tributaries of such headwaters (giving due compensation to the riparian proprietors as hereinafter mentioned of the properties mentioned in the Second Schedule

15 hereto), for the purpose of increasing the supply of water for the use of the inhabitants of the said city; and for the last-mentioned purpose to empower the said Corporation to extend and lay mains and pipes from the present waterworks of the said Corporation to connect with such head-waters of the said streams: And whereas it is expedient

20 that the said Corporation should be empowered to acquire the freehold and possession of the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of using the same as a catchwater or gathering ground (giving to the respective owners thereof due compensaton to be ascertained in manner hereinafter mentioned):

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

Interpretation.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Auckland Waterworks Extension Act, 1904."

2. The following words and expressions shall have the several meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there shall be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, that is to say:—

The words "land" or "lands" shall include messuages, 10 lands, tenements, and hereditaments of any tenure, and any estate or interest therein:

The expression "the said city" shall mean the City of Auck-

 $\operatorname{land}:$

The expressions "the Corporation" or "the said Corporation" 15 shall mean the Corporation of the City of Auckland:

The word "head-waters" shall, so far as the said Huia Stream is concerned, mean all the waters thereof above the point where the northern boundary-line of Allotment 8a of the Parish of Karangahape, in the Provincial District of Auckland, abuts on the said stream; and, so far as the said Nihotupu Stream is concerned, means all the waters thereof above the point where the north-western boundary-line of Lot 7 of the Parish of Waikomiti, in the said provincial district, abuts on the said stream; and, so far as the said Waitakerei Stream is concerned, means all the waters thereof above the point where the southern boundary-line of the northern middle portion of Allotment 50 of the Parish of Waitakerei, in the said provincial district, abuts on the said stream:

The expressions "the Council" or "the said Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Auckland:

The words "the Mayor" shall mean the Mayor for the time being of the City of Auckland:

The words "the Town Clerk" shall mean the Town Clerk for 35 the time being of the City of Auckland:

The expression "the waterworks" shall mean the waterworks belonging to the Corporation of the City of Auckland, and all reservoirs, cisterns, tanks, aqueducts, drains, cuts, races, sluices, mains, pipes, plants, weirs, engines, and 40 other works and appliances whatsoever connected there-

with:

The word "stream" shall include springs, brooks, and all

other running waters:

The expressions "riparian proprietors" or "the said riparian 45 proprietors" shall mean all persons who at the time of the passing of this Act shall be lawfully entitled to take and use or divert and use the head-waters of the said streams called or known as Nihotupu, Huia, and Waitakerei flowing by or near the said city, or of any 50 of the tributaries thereof, for domestic, manufacturing, or industrial purposes, or for turning water-wheels, or as a

motive power for any kind of machinery, from the said streams or either of them, or their or either of their tributaries, and whose respective rights will be extinguished, abridged, interfered with, or otherwise prejudicially affected by the exercise or partial exercise of the power to take, divert, and impound the head-waters of the said streams and their tributaries hereinafter given to the said Corporation:

The terms "plan" or "said plan" shall mean the plan deposited in the Local Bills Office, at the same time as and with a view to the passing of this Act, showing the course or part of the course of the said streams called or known as Nihotupu, Huia, and Waitakerei, and certain tributaries thereof, and respectively delineating and specifying the lands adjacent thereto which the said Corporation is empowered by this Act to take and acquire for the purpose of a catchwater or gathering ground, and the lands abutting on the said streams the riparian rights whereof may be taken away or prejudicially affected hereby.

3. The said Corporation is hereby empowered to take, divert, and Power to take impound the whole of the water flowing into and in the head-waters of the said streams called or known as Nihotupu, Huia, and Waitakerei (hereinafter called "the said streams"), and all and every of the 25 tributaries thereof as shown in the said plan, and to alter the course of the head-waters of the said streams or either of them, their or either of their tributaries flowing into such head-waters, in such manner as to the said Corporation shall seem expedient for the purpose of increasing the supply of water for the use and benefit of the in-

30 habitants of the said city as hereinafter mentioned.

4. The said Corporation shall make compensation in money to Compensation to the riparian proprietors whose respective rights shall be extinguished, be paid to riparian proprietors. abridged, interfered with, or otherwise prejudicially affected by the exercise of the power hereinbefore given to the said Corporation to 35 take, divert, and impound the head-waters of the said streams and their tributaries flowing into such head-waters, such compensation in money to be ascertained as hereinafter mentioned.

5. Before proceeding to exercise the said power hereinbefore Notice to be given given to take, divert, and impound the head-waters of the said streams water. 40 and of their tributaries flowing into such head-waters, or any part or parts thereof respectively, the said Corporation shall cause a notice in writing to be given to each of the riparian proprietors: Provided always that such notice may be given by serving the same personally upon or by leaving the same at the last-known place of business or 45 abode of the riparian proprietors respectively, or, if the place of business or abode of such riparian proprietors be not known, by publishing the same twice in some newspaper circulating in the said city.

6. After service of a notice or notices as last mentioned shall Amount of com-50 have been made, the said Corporation shall with all convenient to be ascertained. speed proceed to ascertain the amount of such money compensation as aforesaid in manner set forth in "The Public Works Act, 1894,"

of intention to take

or any statutory amendment thereof, or as near thereto, *mutatis mutanais*, as may be, which said Act for that and other purposes shall, so far as the same may be applicable to and not inconsistent with the provisions in this Act, be deemed to be incorporated with and form part of this Act: Provided also that immediately from and after giving such notice as aforesaid the rights of all and singular the said riparian proprietors to whom such notice shall have been given shall thenceforth and for ever be effectually extinguished.

By-laws as to preventing waste of water. 7. The said Council are hereby empowered from time to time to make such by-laws as they shall think proper for preventing the 10 water in or from the said streams from being wasted by and for preventing any persons whomsoever from interfering with or destroying or damaging any of the sluices, races, aqueducts, pipes, works, or appliances which shall belong or appertain to or be used by the said Corporation in connection with the said streams; and it is 15 hereby declared that any person who shall wilfully commit a breach of any of such by-laws as aforesaid shall be liable to forfeit and pay to the said Corporation any penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, such penalty to be recovered by the said Corporation in a summary way under "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882," or any Act or 20 Acts amending the same or passed in lieu thereof.

Power to acquire fee-simple of lands.

8. The said Corporation is hereby empowered forthwith to take possession and acquire the fee-simple of any of the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shown or delineated and specified or comprised on the said plan, being the parts thereof tinted brown, pink, and 25 green respectively, if considered by the said Corporation necessary for the purposes of a catchwater or gathering ground in connection with the said waterworks. Notice of election to take such lands to be given to the owners and others having any interest therein within two years from the passing of this Act.

Compensation to persons interested other than as owners in fee-simple. 9. All persons being owners in fee-simple of or having any less estate or interest in any of the lands taken under the authority of this Act shall be entitled to receive compensation for such lands, the amount whereof shall be ascertained in the manner set forth in "The Public Works Act, 1894," or any amendment thereof so in-35 corporated with this Act as aforesaid.

Power to Corporation to do all necessary works. 10. The said Corporation is hereby empowered from time to time to sink such wells or shafts, and make, maintain, procure, or alter such reservoirs, dams, weirs, waterworks, cisterns, tanks, aqueducts, drains, cuts, races, sluices, pipes, culverts, engines, and 40 other works and appliances, and to erect such buildings, upon the said lands which the said Corporation is empowered to take under this Act as the said Corporation shall think proper for the purpose of providing the inhabitants of the said city and the suburbs thereof with a supply or increased supply of water; and for all or 45 any of the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Corporation to lay out and expend so much of the moneys which under or by virtue of this Act or of any other Act the said Corporation is empowered to raise by way of rates, loan, or otherwise howsoever as shall be sufficient for those purposes and as shall for the 50 time being be available for the same.

11. All notices required to be given, served, or sent by post by the said Corporation under or in pursuance of this Act shall be

Officer who is empowered to give necessary notices.

deemed to be sufficiently signed by or on behalf of the said Corporation if the same shall be signed or purport to be signed by the Town Clerk or by an officer of the said Corporation who shall be specially appointed in that behalf by any writing under the hand of 5 the Mayor and seal of the said Corporation, and it shall not be necessary to affix the corporate seal to any of such notices as aforesaid: Provided always that in any case in which any notice may, under the provisions of this or any other Act, be inserted in the New Zealand Gazette or any newspaper the Gazette or newspaper as the 10 case may be containing any such notice with the name of the Town Clerk, or of such officer to be so specially appointed as aforesaid, printed at the foot thereof shall be deemed and taken in any Court of law or equity to be sufficient prima facie evidence that the original of such notice was duly signed by the Town Clerk or such officer as 15 aforesaid on behalf of the said Corporation.

12. The Council is hereby empowered to borrow at a rate of Power to borrow, interest not exceeding four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, for the purpose of purchasing the properties and paying the compensation therefor, and for the riparian rights herein mentioned, 20 and for the purpose of constructing and carrying out the works necessary to obtain and utilise such increased supply of water, a sum

of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

13. Such loan shall be raised and expended exclusively for the Disposal of loan purposes hereinbefore specified, including, however, such commissions money. 25 charges, and expenses (including the cost of obtaining this Act) as the Council may determine to have been actually incurred in connection with such loan.

14. Before any moneys shall be borrowed under this Act the Poll of ratepayers. Council shall take a poll of the ratepayers in the manner provided by 30 section eleven of "The Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1901" (which Act and the amendments thereof are incorporated herein and shall be read herewith mutatis mutandis, except that the words "the day of the said meeting" therein mentioned shall be read for the purposes of this Act as "the day this Act comes into operation," and the 35 words "the Chairman" in that section and in sections thirteen and fourteen thereof shall be read as "the Mayor"), and the result of such poll shall be in favour of the proposal.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

LANDS AUTHORISED TO BE TAKEN.

ALL those parcels of land shown by those parts tinted brown on the said plan, and being Lots 69, 70, 73, 74, north-western part of Lot 75, Lot 76, north-western part of Allotment 78, and north-western part of Allotment 79 of the Parish of Karanga-

All those parcels of land shown by those parts tinted pink on the said plan, being Lots 72, 89, 90, 91, north-western portion of Allotment 92, and the whole of the portions comprising Allotment 75 of the Parish of Waitakerei; the south-western part of the north-eastern portion of Allotment 36, Parish of Karangahape; and Lots 96 and 97, and the whole of the portions comprising Allotments 93 and 94 of the Parish of Waikomiti.

All those parcels of land shown by those parts tinted green on the said plan, and being southern and southern middle parts of Allotments 50, 51, 52, and 62, northern and south-eastern parts of Allotment 63, Allotments 64, 65, 76, 77, 78, 79, and 80, the whole of the portions comprising Allotments 81 and 82, and Allotment 83 of the Parish of Waitakerei.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Lands the Riparian Rights whereof May be prejudicially affected. All those parcels of land shown by those parts edged green on the said plan and abutting on the Huia Stream, and being Allotments 8, 8a, portion of Allotment 9, and Allotments 9a, 12, 13, 14, 17, and 109 of the Parish of Karangahape.

All those parcels of land shown by those parts edged purple on the said plan and abutting on the Nihotupu Stream, and being portions of Allotment 38, and Allotments 33 and 37, Parish of Waikomiti; and Allotment 7, and portion of Allotment 6,

Parish of Karangahape.

All those parcels of land shown by those parts edged brown on the said plan and abutting on the Waitakerei Stream, and being Allotments 1, 1A, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, and 9, the southern part of Allotment 30, Allotments 35 and 36, the northern and northern middle and western middle parts of Allotment 50, and Allotments 84, 85, and 86 of the Parish of Waitakerei.
