A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Banking Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Banking Amendment Act, 1914 Short Title. (No. 2), and shall form part of and be read together with the Banking Act, 1908.

2. Gold exported or attempted to be exported in breach of the Forfeiture of gold 10 provisions of section six of the Banking Amendment Act, 1914, shall illegally exported. be forfeited to His Majesty, and the provisions of the Customs Act, 1913, relating to forfeited goods shall apply to such gold in the same manner as in the case of goods forfeited under that Act.
