

**BUILDING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS AMENDMENT
BILL**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THIS Bill extends the duration of the Building Emergency Regulations Act 1953 for a further year, to the end of 1957.

This will have the effect of continuing in force for the same period the existing regulations in force under the Act, namely, the Building Emergency Regulations 1939 and their amendments and the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939 and their amendments. The latter regulations make general provisions that are necessary to give full effect to the Building Emergency Regulations.

A BILL INTITULED

**An Act to amend the Building Emergency Regulations Act
1953**

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:

10 **1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Building
Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1956, and shall be
read together with and deemed part of the Building
Emergency Regulations Act 1953 (hereinafter referred to as
the principal Act).

15 **2. Duration of principal Act extended to 31 December
1957**—(1) Section six of the principal Act (as amended by
the Building Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1955)
is hereby further amended by omitting from subsection one
the words “nineteen hundred and fifty-six”, and substituting
the words “nineteen hundred and fifty-seven”.

(2) The Building Emergency Regulations Amendment Act
1955 is hereby consequentially repealed.
