A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Title. Zealand) Act, 1923.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the British Nationality and Status short Title and of Aliens (in New Zealand) Amendment Act, 1927, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the British Nationality and Status 10 of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Sections ten and eleven of Part III of the British Nationality National status of and Status of Aliens Act, 1914 (Imperial), as set forth in the First married women. Schedule to the principal Act, are hereby repealed, and the following

15 provisions are substituted therefor:

- (a) A woman who is a British subject shall not lose or be deemed to lose her British nationality by reason of her marriage
- (b) A woman who at the time of her marriage was a natural-born or a naturalized British subject, and who by reason of her having or at any time having had an alien husband has been deemed to be an alien, shall be deemed to be a naturalborn or a naturalized British subject, as the case may be, unless she makes a declaration of alienage within one year after this Act comes into force, or, being abroad at the time this Act comes into force, within one year after she returns to British soil; and section two, subsection five, of the Imperial Act is hereby repealed.

- 3. A woman notwithstanding marriage shall be competent to apply for and to receive a grant of a certificate of naturalization under the same conditions as a man.
- 4. A woman who is a British subject shall notwithstanding marriage cease and be deemed to have ceased to be a British subject under the same conditions as a man and under no others, and the naturalization by marriage under the law of another State shall not be deemed to be naturalization by a voluntary and formal act in section thirteen of the 10 Imperial Act.
- 5. Section twenty-seven of Part III of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914 (Imperial), as set forth in the First Schedule of the principal Act, is hereby amended by striking out the words "A married woman, or."
