A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Bay of Islands Harbour Act, 1920. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Bay of Islands short Title. Harbour Amendment Act, 1936, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Bay of Islands Harbour Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the 10 principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the first day commencement. of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-six.

2. Section three of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding after the words "Schedule hereto" the words "or as defined by Warrant under the hand of the Governor-General issued in terms of the Harbours Act, 1923".

3. The Schedule to the principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following Schedule is hereby enacted in substitution therefor.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained or implied in the principal Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor-General, by Warrant under his hand, to exercise all or any of the powers conferred upon him by virtue of section six of the Harbours Act, 1923, in respect of the port and harbour of Bay of Islands, as therein defined.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area bounded: Commencing at ordinary high-water mark of the northern extremity of Cape Wiwiki; thence by a right line to the eastern extremity of the Nine-pin; thence by a right line to the north-western extremity of Cape Brett at ordinary high-water mark; thence following the coast-line at ordinary high-water mark generally in a northerly direction to the commencing-point, including within such area all bays, tidal streams, rivers, and inlets flowing into the said harbour up to the ordinary high-water mark and the foreshore of all islands within the said area.
