This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives and having this day passed as now printed is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

Borough of New Plymouth Reserves.

ANALYSIS.

A BILL INTITULED

Act to vest certain Public Reserves in the Title. Borough Council of New Plymouth.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Borough of New Short Title.

5 Plymouth Reserves Act, 1877."

2. From and after the passing of this Act the lands described in Land in Schedule to the First Schedule hereto shall be vested without any conveyance or be vested in Borough Council of New assurance in the Borough-Council Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of Plymouth. the Borough of New Plymouth.

3. The Council shall have power to manage and lease the said council may lease lands under the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," lands. for the purposes mentioned in the Schedule, and the rents or profits arising therefrom shall be deemed to be borough funds.

New clause.

15 4. The Council shall have power to construct a reservoir on the land described in the Second Schedule, for the supply of water to the inhabitants of the said borough; and for this purpose the Council may enter on the said land and construct such works as may be necessary to complete the said reservoir: Provided before the works are com-20 menced the site for such reservoir be approved of by the Governor in Council.

Fort-Niger-Reserve.

ALL that parcel of land situate in the Town of New Plymouth, containing by admeasurement three (3) acres two (2) roods seven (7) perches, more or less, being a Military Reserve, and Allotments Nos. 1612, 1613, 1614, and 1615 on the plan of the said town.
