A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to extend the operation of "The Bishop of Title. New Zealand Trusts Act 1858."

HEREAS by "The Bishop of New Zealand Trusts Act 1858" Preamble. the Bishop of New Zealand is authorized to convey certain allotments or parcels of land then held by him in trust for religious educational charitable or other purposes to such trustee or trustees as

- 5 the General Synod shall appoint in that behalf And whereas certain other allotments or parcels of land hereditaments and premises have since been granted conveyed or assured unto George Augustus Bishop of New Zealand and his successors in trust for certain religious educational charitable or other purposes expressed and declared of and
- 10 concerning the same in or endorsed upon the deeds of conveyance respectively granting or assuring the same And whereas the said Bishop of New Zealand is desirous of being divested of the said hereditaments and premises and for the better management thereof that the said hereditaments and premises should be vested in trustees appointed

15 by the said General Synod

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Bishop of New Short Title. 20 Zealand Trusts Act 1868."

2. It shall be lawful for the said Bishop of New Zealand to convey Bishop of New Zealand authorized and assure the said hereditaments and premises or any of them to such ^{Zealand} authorized to convey to trustees. trustee or trustees as the said General Synod shall appoint in that behalf subject nevertheless to all the trusts and for the intents and

25 purposes for which the same were respectively conveyed to or were held in trust by the said George Augustus Bishop of New Zealand. 3. The trustees for the time being of the said hereditaments and premises shall have all and singular the powers of selling exchanging power of selling &c. and leasing the said hereditaments and premises or any part thereof

30 as are particularly described in the Schedule to the said Act annexed.
