A BILL INTITULED

An Act to encourage the Production of Sugar from Beet-root and Title. Sorghum.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Beet-root Sugar Act, Short Title.

2. The Colonial Treasurer shall, out of the Consolidated Fund, Bonus to person pay a bonus of fifty thousand pounds to the person first producing in first producing sugar 10 the colony ten thousand tons of sugar from beet-root or sorghum grown in the colony.

The said bonus shall be paid by annual instalments extending To be paid by instalthrough a period of fifteen years from the first day of January, one ments during period of fifteen years. thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and calculated as to each 15 year's instalment at the rate of one halfpenny for each pound of sugar Rate.

6. "The Beet-root Sugar Act, 1884," is hereby repealed.
