A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to repeal, in so far as it relates to the Colony of New Zealand, an Act of the Imperial Parliament (twenty and twenty-one Victoria, Chapter fifty-three) intituled "An Act to amend the Act for granting a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand."

5 WHEREAS an Act was passed by the Imperial Parliament in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-three, intituled "An Act to amend the Act for granting a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand : " And whereas it is desirable that the said Act should be repealed in

10 so far as it relates to the Colony of New Zealand :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Constitution amending Act Repeal Act, 1883."

15 2. From and after the coming of this Act into operation, the Imperial Act twenty and twenty-one Victoria, chapter fifty-three, amending the Act for granting a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand, shall be repealed in so far as it relates to the said colony.

20 3. This Act shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, and shall not take effect until it shall have been proclaimed by the Governor in the New Zealand Government Gazette.
