This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.

### CUSTOMS AMENDMENT.

#### ANALYSIS

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### A BILL INTITULED

An Act to impose Duties of Customs and to amend the Customs Title.

Acts.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Customs Amendment Act, 1927, Short Title. and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. In the Customs Acts, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"British Preferential Tariff" means the rates of duties and

the exemptions from duty set forth in the column numbered one in the First Schedule hereto, and includes any modification thereof made in accordance with the Customs Acts:

"General Tariff" means the rates of duties and the exemptions from duty set forth in the column numbered two in the *First* Schedule hereto, and includes any modification thereof made

in accordance with the Customs Acts:

"British dominions" includes British protectorates and any territory for the time being subject to a mandate conferred on His Majesty by the League of Nations.

Interpretation.

No. 96--3.

Abolition of existing duties.

Application of British Preferential and General Tariffs.

- 3. All duties of Customs and all exemptions from such duties imposed or allowed under the several enactments or other authorities enumerated in the *Second* Schedule hereto are hereby abolished.
- 4. Upon the coming into operation of this Act and thereafter while this Act remains in force, but subject to any provisions of the Customs Acts as to the alteration of duties.—
  - (a) There shall be levied, collected, and paid on all goods being the produce or manufacture of some part of the British dominions and imported into New Zealand or entered therein for home consumption after the commencement of this Act the rates 10 of Customs duties (if any) set forth in the British Preferential Tariff; and
  - (b) There shall be levied, collected, and paid on all goods being the produce or manufacture of a country not being part of the British dominions and imported into New Zealand or entered 15 therein for home consumption after the commencement of this Act the rates of Customs duties (if any) set forth in the General Tariff.
- 5. (1) Every resolution of the House of Representatives passed on or after the thirteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and 20 twenty-seven, and before the passing of this Act, purporting to impose any duties of Customs or to create any exemptions from such duties, shall be deemed to have taken effect and to have had the force of law, according to the tenor of such resolution, and to have so continued until the passing of this Act, or until altered or revoked, before the 25 passing of this Act, by a resolution of the House of Representatives.

(2) Every such resolution as is mentioned in the *last preceding* subsection shall be deemed to be revoked on the passing of this Act:

Provided that all duties which, by virtue of the said resolutions, have become due and payable since the passing thereof and before the 30 passing of this Act, and all penalties and forfeitures which have been incurred, shall be recovered and enforced notwithstanding the revocation of the said resolutions by this section.

- 6. (1) Except as expressly provided in any such resolution, no additional duty shall be chargeable in respect of goods entered for home 35 consumption during the currency of any resolution referred to in the last preceding section by reason merely of the fact that the duties or exemptions imposed or created by such resolution have been altered by any subsequent resolution or by this Act.
- (2) When any duty has been paid under the authority of any such 40 resolution in excess of the duty payable under this Act the Collector may allow a refund of such excess.
- 7. (1) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Act shall affect the agreement for Customs reciprocity made between the Governments of New Zealand and the Commonwealth of Australia and ratified by the 45 Tariff Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1922, or shall affect any Order in Council made for the purposes of or in relation to that agreement under the authority of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921.

Ratification of certain resolutions imposing duties and allowing exemptions.

Goods entered during currency of resolutions not to be affected by higher rates of duty.

Saving of treaty with Commonwealth of Australia.

- (2) Subject to the terms of the agreement referred to in the last preceding subsection the Minister may, by notice published in the Gazette, at any time apply the British Preferential Tariff to any goods specified or referred to in such notice, and being the produce or 5 manufacture of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (3) The duties and exemptions from duty in force at the commencement of this Act in respect of goods being the produce or manufacture of the Commonwealth of Australia shall, notwithstanding the repeal of any enactment by this Act, continue in force unless and until altered in 10 accordance with the provisions of the last preceding subsection, or otherwise in accordance with the Customs Acts.

8. Nothing in this Act shall be so construed or shall so operate as Saving of treaty to conflict with the Schedule of Customs duties and exemptions contained in an Order in Council made under the authority of the Customs Amend-15 ment Act, 1921, on the seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and published in the Gazette of the tenth day of the same month (fixing rates of duty and exemptions from duty in respect of certain goods being the produce or manufacture of the Union of South Africa):

20 Provided that while such Order in Council remains in force no higher duty shall be levied on any such goods than would be levied if the goods were subject to the British Preferential Tariff.

9. (1) The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in this special provisions Act shall be in force in the Cook Islands on and from a date to be deter- as to Cook Islands. 25 mined by the Governor-General by Order in Council, and until an Order in Council under this section comes into force the duties and exemptions in force in those islands on the commencement of this Act shall continue to be in force and allowed.

(2) On the coming into force of any such Order in Council the 30 duties and exemptions provided for in this Act shall be in force in the Cook Islands, and the duties and exemptions in force therein on the commencement of this Act shall cease and determine:

Provided that nothing herein shall affect the provisions of Part XXI

of the principal Act.

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10. (1) The Third Schedule to the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, Exemptions from is hereby repealed and the *Third* Schedule to this Act substituted therefor.

(2) All references in the Customs Acts to the Third Schedule to the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, shall hereafter be read as references to the Third Schedule to this Act.

11. (1) If with respect to any goods or to any class of goods special suitable or intended for use for manufacturing, industrial, agricultural, provisions as to duty on goods scientific, therapeutic, or similar purposes, and being the produce or of a class not manufacture of a country not forming part of the British dominions, produced in British the Minister is satisfied that goods of a like kind are not economically dominions. 45 produced or manufactured in the British dominions, he may in his discretion direct that such goods or that any goods of such class be admitted as if they were the produce or manufacture of some part of the British dominions, or, in the alternative, that they be admitted at a rate of duty intermediate between the rate specified in the British 50 Preferential Tariff and the rate specified in the General Tariff.

with South Africa.

(2) This section shall be deemed to have been in force as from the thirteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

(3) Any direction given by the Minister under this section may in its application to any goods be revoked at any time before such goods

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are entered for home comsumption.

Minister may determine the free-on-board export cash price of goods.

12. Where the amount of duty payable on any goods depends in whole or in part on the free-on-board export cash price of those goods, and such goods are imported otherwise than on the sale thereof, or otherwise than on the sale thereof at the free-on-board export cash price, the Minister may determine such price in such manner and at 10 such sum as he thinks just, and his determination shall be final.

Special provisions for computing measurement of sawn dressed timber.

13. (1) For the purposes of the Tariff the Minister may direct that sawn dressed timber or any class of such timber shall be measured as if the actual thickness thereof were increased by such amount as he may prescribe in that behalf. The maximum amount that may be so added 15 in any case shall, as the Minister may determine, be either three-sixteenths of an inch, or twenty per centum of the actual thickness. Every direction under this section shall be given by notice published in the Gazette, and may at any time be in like manner revoked.

(2) On the entry of any sawn dressed timber to which any direction 20 given by the Minister as aforesaid is applicable, the Collector shall compute the number of superficial feet contained therein as if the actual

thickness thereof were increased to the extent prescribed.

14. (1) The power to impose duties of Customs conferred on the Governor-General in Council by this section may be exercised in any of 25

the following cases, but not otherwise, that is to say:—

(a) In the case of goods imported into New Zealand from any foreign country, if in the opinion of the Governor-General that foreign country discriminates, to the disadvantage of goods the produce or manufacture of New Zealand, between those 30

goods and the goods of any other country:

(b) In the case of goods imported into New Zealand from any foreign country, if in the opinion of the Governor-General the duty charged by that country on the importation of goods being the produce or manufacture of New Zealand is 35 excessive; or in the case of goods imported into New Zealand from any foreign country that restricts (otherwise than by Customs duties) or prohibits wholly or partially the importation into that country of goods being the produce or manufacture of New Zealand:

(c) In the case of goods imported into New Zealand from any foreign country, if in relation to such goods there is no treaty, agreement, or arrangement in force between the Government of that country and the Government of New Zealand.

(2) In any of the cases mentioned in the last preceding subsection 45 the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, impose such duties of Customs as he thinks fit, not exceeding in any case twenty-five per centum ad valorem on any goods being the produce or manufacture of a foreign country to which the Order relates, and which may be imported into New Zealand on or after a date to be therein specified in that behalf: 50

Power to impose special duties in certain cases on goods imported from foreign countries.

Provided that the powers hereby conferred on the Governor-General shall not be so exercised as to contravene the terms of any treaty, agreement, or arrangement for the time being in force between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of any other country.

(3) Any Order in Council under this section may be at any time in

like manner varied or revoked.

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(4) The duties imposed on any goods pursuant to this section may be imposed whether such goods are otherwise liable to duty or not, and shall be in addition to any other duties to which any such goods may be liable.

(5) Any Order in Council under this section may relate generally to all goods being the produce or manufacture of any foreign country specified in the Order, or may relate to any specified goods or to goods of any specified class or classes.

(6) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the operation

15 of any other provisions of the Customs Acts.

15. The Customs Acts are hereby amended in manner indicated Miscellaneous in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

16. (1) The enactments mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto

are hereby repealed to the extent indicated in that Schedule.

20 (2) All duties which have become due and payable and all penalties saving of and forfeitures which have been incurred prior to the commencement of existing rights this Act shall be recovered and enforced in the same manner as if this Act had not been passed.

### THE CUSTOMS TARIFF.

Notes.—The headings of the respective classes are used solely for convenience of classification, and do not in any way affect the interpretation of the Tariff.

The term "agriculture" as used in the Tariff includes horticulture and viticulture; the term "iron" includes steel, or steel and iron combined; the term "specific duties" means duties imposed according to a specified quantity, weight, size or number; the term "wine" includes medicated wine or wine mixed with food, and such spirituous beverages and fluid or semi-fluid foods containing not more than 40 per cent. of proof spirit as may be so decided by the Minister.

Steam engines, gas engines, oil engines, electric or other motors, and parts of the foregoing, are not included in the expression "machines, machinery, machine tools or appliances," as used in the Tariff.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

### EXEMPTIONS FROM PRIMAGE DUTY.

Live animals, including cattle and horses.

Radium, mesothorium, and other radio-active metallic elements, also inorganic salts of the same. Surgeons', physicians', dentists', and opticians' appliances, instruments and materials, viz.:—

Appliances (including splints) for wear, peculiarly adapted to correct a deformity of the human body, to afford support to an abnormal condition of the human body, or to reduce or alleviate such condition, or to substitute any part of such body; stump socks; crutches; ear-trumpets; ear-tubes, and audiphones, for the partially deaf.

Ostrich-feathers grown in New Zealand, when returned from abroad dressed, or dyed, upon evidence being produced to the satisfaction of a Collector of Customs as to their previous exportation.

Antiques and works of art, as may be approved by the Minister, and on conditions prescribed by him provided that he is satisfied that such articles were produced or manufactured at least one hundred years prior to the date of importation.

Medals—viz., war medals, humane societies', and similar, also such miniatures of the same as may be approved by the Minister; old coins.

Musical instruments, and parts, viz.:-

(1) Band instruments entered by or for any band or musical society duly registered and incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act, 1908, on declaration by a responsible officer of such band or society that the said instruments will remain the property of the band or society and will not be sold or otherwise disposed of without payment of the duty otherwise imposed under the Tariff.

(2) Musical instruments, imported for exclusive use by bands which are approved by the Defence Department, and under such conditions as the Minister may prescribe.

Paintings, statuary, other works of art, curios, and other articles approved by the Minister, for display in public museums, the buildings of *public institutions* or art associations registered as corporate bodies, public parks or other public places, on such conditions as may be prescribed by the Minister.

Trophies, prizes, flags, medals, medalions, badges, and other decorations, which have been awarded or presented or which are to be awarded or presented to persons in New Zealand and which have been donated by persons resident abroad; trophies and prizes won abroad; medals, badges, flags, and similar articles, approved by the Minister, imported by New Zealand branches of the Navy League, St. John Ambulance Association, or similar patriotic ambulance or other societies.

Cylinders for compressed gases.

### EXEMPTIONS FROM PRIMAGE DUTY—continued.

Crude petroleum, crude residual oil, once run shale oil, and crude distillates of petroleum, when imported in bulk in ships' bottoms.

Horse-boxes, and other stock-boxes, imported with the stock for which they have been used on the voyage.

Articles n.e.i., suited for the use of the blind, deaf, or dumb, as may be approved by the Minister. Apparatus, appliances, articles, and materials, for educational purposes, as may be approved by the Minister, and under conditions prescribed by him.

Heirlooms not exceeding in value £100, on such conditions as may be approved by the Minister. Natural-history specimens, and such ethnological or similar specimens as may be approved by the Minister.

Official supplies, uniforms, flags, and such other articles as may be approved by the Minister, for the official use of Consular officers, Trade Commissioners, or other accredited representatives of any British or foreign Government.

Passengers' baggage and effects, which are not intended for any other person or persons or for sale, viz.-

(a) Wearing apparel and other personal effects which have been worn or are in use by persons arriving in New Zealand.

(b) Implements, instruments, and tools of trade, occupation, or employment of any passenger, not exceeding £100 in value, which have been in use by such passenger for twelve months prior to his embarkation.

(c) Household or other effects which have been in use for twelve months prior to embarkation by the persons or families bringing them to New Zealand, not exceeding in value £100 for each adult passenger, and £50 for each child, provided that the total value of household or other effects so imported does not exceed in value £300 for the members of any one family.

Regalia, emblems, certificates, almanacs, and banners, being the property of any society or branch registered under the Friendly Societies Act, 1909.

Returned empties identified as such to the satisfaction of a Collector of Customs.

Shipbuilders' models of vessels, suited only for exhibition; models of inventions, as may be approved by the Minister.

Coal.

Earthen jars, exceeding 3 gallons in capacity containing sulphuric, nitric, hydrochloric, or other acids; provided that declaration is made on importation that such jars will be exported from New Zealand when empty, and that they will not be refilled in the Dominion.

Printed books papers music and advertising matter, n.e.i., sent for free distribution in New Zealand by Governments, Local Government Bodies, and other public bodies (approved by the Minister) in countries outside New Zealand.

### A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Dairy-produce Export Control Act, 1923. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:--
