A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1961

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be
5 cited as the Crimes Amendment Act 1988, and shall be read
together with and deemed part of the Crimes Act 1961
(hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of January
1989.

16B. Contravention of statute—Section 107 of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding, as subsections (2) and (3), the following subsections:

“(2) Nothing in subsection (1) of this section applies to any 5
contravention of any Imperial enactment or Imperial subordinate legislation that is part of the laws of New Zealand, or to any omission to do any act which any such Imperial enactment or Imperial subordinate legislation requires to be done.

“(3) In subsection (2) of this section, the terms ‘Imperial 10
enactment’ and ‘Imperial subordinate legislation’ have the meanings given to them by section 2 of the Imperial Laws Application Act 1988.”
