An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Crimes Amendment Short Title. Act (No. 2) 1955, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Crimes Act 1908 (hereinafter referred See Reprint to as the principal Act).
- 2. (1) Section three hundred and sixty-five of the Use of force to principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection one, the following subsection:
- "(1A) Every such warrant to search any building, ship, carriage, or place shall authorize the constable named 15 therein at any time or times within one month from the date thereof to enter into the building, ship, carriage, or place with such assistants as may be necessary, and, if necessary, to use force for making such entry, whether by
