This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to alter certain Duties of Customs and Excise, and to Title. amend the Law relating thereto.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN, -- We, your Majesty's most Address. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards raising the necessary supplies to defray your Majesty's public expenses, and making an addition to the public revenue, have freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto your Majesty the duties hereinafter mentioned, 10 and do therefore most humbly beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows: 15

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Customs and Excise Short Title. Duties Act, 1891."

2. There shall be levied, collected, and paid to and for the use Duty on unmanuof Her Majesty, upon unmanufactured tobacco entered to be manu- entered for manufactured in the colony, at the time of removal from a bonded facture in colony. 20 warehouse, or from any importing ship, to any licensed tobacco manufactory, for manufacturing purposes only into tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, or snuff, the duties following, that is to say,—

(1.) On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three,— A duty of one shilling and sixpence the pound; and

(2.) On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six,— A duty of two shillings the pound.

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Duty on tobacco manufactured in colony. 3. On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, there shall be levied, collected, and paid upon tobacco manufactured in the colony, whether from tobacco grown in the colony, or from imported unmanufactured tobacco, or from a combination of the two kinds, at the time of making entry for home consumption thereof, the several duties of excise, as follows:—

Until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-six,—

Tobacco, one shilling the pound;

Cigars, cigarettes, and snuff, one shilling and sixpence 10

the pound.

No compensation if excise duty on tobacco altered.

4. It is hereby enacted that no claim for compensation shall be entertained or sum of money be paid out of the public moneys of the colony to any tobacco manufacturer or person in any way interested in the growth, manufacture, or sale of tobacco, in respect of any 15 legislation whatever affecting the excise duty on New-Zealand-grown and manufactured tobacco, or the laws or regulations relating to the manufacture of tobacco.

5. This Act shall be read and construed with "The Tobacco Act, 1879," "The Tobacco Act 1879 Amendment Act, 1888," and 20 "The Customs Laws Consolidation Act, 1882."
