Title. 1. Short Title.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to restrict the Sale and Possession of Title. Contraceptives.⁴

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New 5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. This Act may be cited as the Contraceptives Act, Short Title. 1932.

2. (1) Every person commits an offence who—

(a) Not being a registered chemist sells contraceptives and possession 10 to any person other than a registered chemist for any other purpose than resale in the ordinary course of business:

(b) Whether a registered chemist or not sells or other-

wise disposes of contraceptives to any person under the age of eighteen years:

(c) Being a person under the age of eighteen years has contraceptives in his or her possession.

(2) Every person committing any offence as aforesaid 20 shall be liable on summary conviction-

> (a) To a fine of twenty pounds in the case of a first offence :

(b) To a fine of one hundred pounds or imprisonment for a term of three months in the case of a second or any subsequent offence.

3. The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order-in Council, make all such regulations as he deems necessary for the effectual carrying out of the object of this Act, and may prescribe fines not exceeding *twenty* pounds in any case for the breach of any such regulation.
