A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Chinese Immigrants Act Amendment Act, 1895," and it shall be read with "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881." Short Title.

10 2. Sections five and nine of "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881," and section seven of "The Chinese Immigrants Act Amendment Act, 1888," are hereby amended by substituting "one hundred" in lieu of "ten" wherever the latter word occurs in those sections. Poll-tax raised to £100.
