A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Codlin Moth Act, 1884."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Codlin Moth Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1886." It shall be read and construed together with "The Codlin Moth Act, 1884," herein referred to as "the said Act."

Short Title.

10 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act the Governor, for satisfactory cause shown to him, may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any part of the colony, or any area therein, to be an unclean district within the meaning of the said Act, and may also from time to time amend, enlarge, or curtail the limits of any district so proclaimed, or revoke any such Proclamation.

Governor may proclaim districts as infected with moth.

15 All the provisions of the said Act shall operate with respect to a district proclaimed by the Governor under this Act in the same manner as if such district had been proclaimed by a Borough or County Council under the said Act.
