## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to allow Private Lands to be used for Title. Cemeteries.

B<sup>E</sup> IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Cemeteries Manage- Short Title.

2. Whenever in any district, city, town, or place, or near thereto, Local bodies may there is no public cemetery, or where it is desirable to close any agree for use of lands for cemeteries. existing cemetery or to establish another cemetery, the Council of any county or borough may agree with the owner of any private lands 10 situate within a county, and outside of the limits of any borough or town, to set apart such lands as may be suitable for a private cemetery under this Act.

3. Every such cemetery shall be subject, in all cases, to the fol- Conditions of use. lowing conditions:-

(1.) The Council of the county or borough, as the case may be, shall give public notice of any lands being set apart for a cemetery under this Act, and thereafter no portion of such lands shall be used by the owner thereof or any person except for the purpose of a cemetery, until such cemetery is closed.

(2.) The cemetery shall be open at all reasonable hours, and the public shall have free access thereto.

(3.) The owner shall, on request, dispose of the fee-simple of any portion of the lands in such cemetery to private persons for the purpose of burial or erecting monuments, if any such lands are available; the limits of the portion to be disposed of to any one person to be fixed by general regulations.

(4.) A portion of the cemetery, in extent in each case as the Council of the county or borough shall determine, shall be set apart, kept, and maintained for the burial therein, free of any charge, of the bodies of poor persons, and of such persons from hospitals, lunatic asylums, gaols, prisons, and other public institutions, as may be required by the person in charge of any such institution.

(5.) Upon the request of the governing body of any separate religious denomination or sect, the owner shall set apart and keep a portion of the cemetery to be used for the 10 exclusive interment of the bodies of members of such

denomination or sect.

(6.) The owner of the lands shall have the entire management of the cemetery, subject to such general regulations, and to such fees for burials in any part thereof, as the Governor 15

may from time to time approve.

(7.) The owner aforesaid, and his heirs or assigns, shall, subject to all regulations to be made as aforesaid, have all the powers granted to trustees of public cemeteries under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act. 1877"

(8.) The provisions of the above-named Act numbered respectively nine to twenty inclusive, twenty-three to thirty inclusive, thirty-two to thirty-five inclusive, and thirty-eight (except as to inspection of accounts), shall apply in respect of every cemetery opened under this Act, and to 25 the owner aforesaid, in the same manner as the said provisions apply to public cemeteries, and to the trustees

(9.) All matters required by the aforesaid Act to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, shall in respect of the same 30 matters under this Act, be published instead in some newspaper having general circulation in the district or place where the cemetery is situate, once at least in two con-

secutive weeks.

4. When any cemetery shall be opened under this Act, the 35 Governor may direct any cemeteries within a radius of ten miles of the first-named cemetery to be closed in accordance with the provisions of the Act in the next following section mentioned.

5. Every cometery opened under this Act shall be subject to and may be closed under the provisions of "The Burial-Grounds Closing 40 Act, 1874."

6. The powers and functions granted by this Act to the Council of any county shall, in respect of all parts of the colony wherein the whole of "The Counties Act, 1876," is not in force, be exercisable by the Governor.

7. "The Auckland Burial Ground Act, 1871," is hereby repealed.
