

CONTROL OF PRICES AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill amends the Control of Prices Act 1947.

Clause 1 relates to the Short Title.

Clause 2 inserts in section 2 (1) of the principal Act a definition of the expression "performance of services", which is used in that Act but not defined (see, for example, the definition of "price" in section 2 (1) and sections 44, 45, and 46).

"Performance of services" is defined as including the doing of any thing pursuant to a contract or agreement with any person (not being a contract or agreement of service between master and servant) which confers any right or benefit on that person or any other person.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Control of Prices Act 1947

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Control of Prices Amendment Act 1971, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Control of Prices Act 1947* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 10 **2. Meaning of "performance of services"**—Section 2 of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting in subsection (1), after the definition of the term "Minister", the following definition:

“Performance of services’ includes, but without limiting the generality of that expression, the doing of any thing pursuant to a contract or agreement with any person (not being a contract or agreement of service between master and servant) which confers any right or benefit on that person or any other person.” 5
