4. Questions as to misconduct of officers may be referred to any two or more persons instead of the Civil Service Board.

An Act to amend "The Civil Service Act 1866."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Civil Service Act Short Title. 5 Amendment Act 1871.'

2. The sections of "The Civil Service Act 1866" numbered from Provisions of "The thirty to forty-three both inclusive and all other provisions of the said Civil Service Act Act relating to retiring allowances are hereby repealed: Provided allowances repealed however that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect the rights claims astoofficers appointed astoofficers appointed after the passing of 10 and interests under the said Act of persons appointed to office before this Act. the passing of this Act.
