AN ACT to alter and amend "The Customs Tariff Act, Title. 1866."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Customs Tariff Short Title. Amendment Act 1870."

2. On and after the twenty-ninth day of June one thousand New duties on eight hundred and seventy, there shall be levied collected and paid to articles herein enumerated. Her Majesty her heirs and successors, on the articles next hereinafter mentioned on importation into New Zealand, or on being cleared from any warehouse for home consumption, the several Duties of Customs following, that is to say-

On and after the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the goods wares and merchandise next hereinafter mentioned shall be exempt from the payment of any Duties of Customs on importation, or on being cleared from any warehouse for home consumption, if imported separately or in packages containing goods not liable to Custom's Duty.

6. The Duties of Customs imposed by this Act shall be raised "Customs Regulation levied collected and paid under the provisions of "The Customs Act, 1858," to apply. Regulation Act, 1858," and "The Customs Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1868," and subject also to all such provisions and regulations as may for the time being be in force for the collection management and receipt of the duties of import in the Colony of New Zealand.

Zealand. 7. The sections of "The Customs Tariff Act, 1866," numbered Certain sections of four, five, seven, eight, ninc, ten, and twelve, shall be deemed to be "The Customs Tariff Act, 1866," incorpo-rated.

8. It is hereby declared and enacted that the rate of duty Duty on Spirits chargeable on Spirits distilled within the Colony shall not be altered distilled in Colony not to vary with unless by some Act of the General Assembly expressly altering such Customs Duty on duty; and the expression "a duty one-half of that charged for the Spirits. time being upon a gallon of Spirits imported into the Colony," where used in the sixtieth section of "The Distillation Act 1868," shall be taken to mean "a duty equal to one-half of that charged on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine upon a gallon of Spirits imported into the Colony."
