A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Acts relating to Dentists.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Dentists Acts Amendment Act, 1891."

The sixth section of "The Dentists Act, 1880," is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted that any person being the holder of a certificate (however designated) granted by any person or body in a British possession duly empowered for that purpose, showing that the holder is entitled to practise dentistry in such possession, shall, on proof that he is of good character, and on payment of the registration fee, be entitled to be registered under "The Dentists Act, 1880," without any further examination.</p>

Repeal of section 6, "The Dentists Act, 1880."

The proof that the person or body granting the certificate to practise dentistry was duly empowered to do so shall lie upon the person so applying for registration in New Zealand.

New clause.

Whenever any person is refused registration as a colonial dentist or as a foreign dentist under the circumstances mentioned in section nine of "The Dentists Act, 1880," the Board of Examiners shall, on the request of such person, appoint a time and place for his examination under the said Act and the by-laws or regulations then in force thereunder.</p>

Persons refused registration may claim to be examined.

And if such person shall duly pass such examination in dentistry he shall be entitled to a certificate and to be registered under the said Act, and all the provisions of the said Act so far as applicable shall extend and apply to the case herein provided for accordingly.

3. "The Dentists Act 1880 Amendment Act, 1881," is hereby amended as follows, to wit: In line six of subsection one of section three thereof, the words "within one year" are hereby repealed.

<p>35</p>	<p>4. The Senate shall appoint a Board of Examiners for each of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, for the purpose of conducting examinations and granting certificates under the Dentist Acts and this Act.</p>
