This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Dentists Act, 1908.

Title.

WHEREAS a Commission appointed under the Commissions of Inquiry Preamble. Act, 1908, to investigate and report upon the claims of certain persons 5 to be given an opportunity of qualifying for registration under the Dentists Act, 1908, otherwise than in the manner laid down in that Act, has recommended that certain persons named in the Schedule hereto be given such an opportunity on conditions set out in the report: And whereas it is desirable to give effect to the recommendation of the 10 Commission and to make certain other provisions as hereinafter set out:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Dentists Amendment Act, 1926, Short Title. 15 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dentists Act; 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1.) Any person referred to in the Schedule hereto may apply to Provisions for be registered as a dentist, and shall, on payment of the fees prescribed examination of in respect of registration by the principal Act, be entitled to be so dentists. 20 registered, if he—

(a.) Passes an examination in general knowledge to be prescribed and conducted by the Minister, unless he satisfies the Minister that he has attained such a standard of general knowledge as to render an examination unnecessary; and

(b.) Passes an examination in dentistry, including dental surgery, to be prescribed and conducted by the Senate of the University of New Zealand at the request of the Director-General of Health.

No. 100—2.

(2.) Examinations under this section shall, if required, be held in the month of December in each of the years nineteen hundred and twenty-seven and nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and no application for registration under this section shall be received by the Registrar-General after the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine:

Provided that on the written request of any of the persons referred to in the Schedule hereto, made to the Director-General of Health not later than the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, examinations may also be held in the month of December, 10

nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

(3.) There shall be payable by candidates for examination under this section such fees as may be prescribed in that behalf by the Minister or the Senate, as the case may be. If any persons apply to be examined in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six the fees for the 15 examinations in that year may be special fees.

(4.) Except in the case of persons desiring to sit for examination in December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, as hereinbefore provided, no person shall be entitled to sit for an examination under this section unless, on or before the thirtieth day of April, nineteen hundred and 20 twenty-seven, he has given notice in writing to the Director-General of

Health of his intention so to do.

(5.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section two or in section six of the Dentists Amendment Act, 1921-22, it shall be lawful for any registered dentist, until the thirty-first day of March, 25 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, but no longer, to permit any person whose name is included in the Schedule hereto, and who has taken the steps prescribed by the last preceding subsection entitling him to sit for an examination under this section, to practise dentistry and to perform dental operations on the premises where such dentist is practising, but 30 only under his immediate and continuous personal supervision; and it shall be lawful for any such person so to practise dentistry and to perform dental operations.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the principal Act, Sydney Francis Macpherson, of Invercargill, shall be entitled to be 35 registered as a dentist under the principal Act upon application to the Registrar-General in that behalf, accompanied by satisfactory proof that he was qualified to be registered as a dentist under the provisions of the Dentists Act, 1904, and upon payment of the fee prescribed for registration.
