1. No member of House of Representatives or Provincial Councils to hold certain 3. Short title.

A BILL to disqualify members of the House of Representatives and Title. Provincial Councils from holding certain Offices connected with the administration of Justice.

HEREAS it is expedient that Members of the House of Preamble. Representatives and Provincial Councils should be disqualified from holding certain offices connected with the administration of justice,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand, as follows.

1. That no person being a Member of the House of Re-No member of House presentatives of New Zealand, or of a Provincial Council of any Provincial Councils to Province of New Zealand, shall, during the time of his being hold certain offices any such member, be capable of being a Judge of the Supreme ministration of justice. Court, a Registrar or Deputy-Registrar of the Supreme Court, or a Sheriff, or a Resident Magistrate, or a Commissioner of a Court of Request.

2. This Act shall commence and take effect from and after Commencement of Act the day or date on which the now present General Assembly shall be dissolved by the Governor of New Zealand, or cease and determine by operation of law.

4. This Act shall be entitled and may be cited as the short title. "Disqualification Act, 1856."
