A BILL INTITULED

An Act to confer certain Powers on the Dunedin City Title. Council.

WHEREAS by virtue of the fact that the Dunedin Preamble.
5 Public Hospital is bounded by public thoroughfares the patients therein are subjected to much disturbance and discomfort at night by reason of the noise caused by vehicular traffic in the said thoroughfares, and particularly by the traffic in King Street and Cumberland
10 Street: And whereas it is in the public interest that special powers should be granted to the Dunedin City

special powers should be granted to the Dunedin City Council to enable it to make by-laws regarding the use of the said streets by vehicular traffic during certain hours:

Be it therefore enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Dunedin City Short Title. Empowering Act, 1937.

No. 8—1.

Interpretation.

Power to make by-laws in respect of vehicular traffic in certain streets.

- 2. In this Act "Council" means the Dunedin City Council.
- 3. (1) The Council may from time to time make such by-laws as it thinks fit for the purpose of regulating, controlling, or prohibiting the use of vehicles of any kind between the hours of eight o'clock p.m. of every day and six o'clock a.m. on the following day in those parts of King Street and Cumberland Street in the City of Dunedin situated between Frederick Street and Hanover Street in such city.
- (2) The Council may, if it thinks fit, provide that any by-law made pursuant to the powers herein contained shall not apply to persons residing in such parts of King Street and Cumberland Street as aforesaid, or shall apply only to such extent and in such 15 manner as the Council thinks fit.

4. This Act shall be deemed to be in substitution for the Dunedin City Empowering Act, 1935, which is hereby repealed.
