## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Dangerous Goods Act, 1869," and "The Dangerous Goods Act Amendment Act, 1870."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Dangerous Goods Act, Preamble. 1869," and "The Dangerous Goods Act Amendment Act, 1870," hereinafter called the said Acts:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New 5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Dangerous Goods Short Title. Act Amendment Act, 1877."

2. The Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, Governor may 10 declare that petroleum or any of the articles or products included declare that in that expression by "The Dangerous Goods Act Amendment Act, shall come within 1870," shall come within the provisions of the said Acts, or any one or the provisions of the more of such provisions, notwithstanding that they do not give off an above inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than one hundred and 15 ten degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer; and may from time to time in like manner revoke, alter, or amend any such order. So long as such order shall remain in force, the articles and products therein mentioned shall be subject to the provisions of the said Acts, or to such part thereof as in such order shall be prescribed.

3. The Governor may by such order, or from time to time by Corder in Council, declare that the provisions of any Order in Council of provisions of made under section two of this Act shall only apply to the parts or Orders in Council. places within the colony specified in such order; and may from time to time in like manner revoke, alter, or amend such order.
