A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Continuance for Three Years Title.
of every House of Representatives.

WHEREAS by the law as at present established in New Zealand, Preamble.
every House of Representatives, unless the General Assembly
is sooner dissolved, continues for the period of five years from the day
of the return of the writs for choosing such House, and no longer :

5 **BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED** by the General Assembly of New
Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Duration of House Short Title.
of Representatives Act, 1876.”
