## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Continuance for Three Years of every House of Representatives. Title.

**W**HEREAS by the law as at present established in New Zealand, every House of Representatives, unless the General Assembly is sooner dissolved, continues for the period of five years from the day of the return of the writs for choosing such House, and no longer : Preamble

5 BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Duration of House of Representatives Act, 1877.” Short Title.

10 2. Every House of Representatives shall henceforth, unless the General Assembly shall be sooner dissolved, continue for the period of three years from the day of the return of the writs for choosing such House, and no longer. Every House of Representatives shall continue for three years.
