A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to vest in the Corporation of the City of Tille. Dunedin, as a site for a Town Hall, a portion of Reserve No. I on the Plan of the Town of Dunedin, now vested in the said Corporation in trust for a Public Market for the City of Dunedin and its Inhabitants.

WHEREAS the parcel of land described in the First Schedule Presmble. hereto was, by a grant from the Crown made under the provisions of "The Public Reserves Act, 1854," and dated the twentyeighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, 5 granted to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago and his

- 5 granted to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago and his successors upon trust as a site for a public hospital: And whereas the said parcel of land having been found unsuitable as a site for the purposes of a hospital, it was by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago passed in the thirtieth
- 10 year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Session XXIII., No. 257), shortly intituled "The Dunedin Reserves Management Ordinance, 1867," enacted that the said parcel of land should be and the same was thereby transferred to and vested in the Corporation of the City of Dunedin and its successors as a corporate body, to be held by the
- 15 said Corporation and its successors in trust for a public market for the City of Dunedin and its inhabitants: And whereas the Corporation of the City of Dunedin are desirous to use that [a] portion of the said parcel^{*}_oof land which is particularly specified and described in the Second Schedule hereto as a site for a town hall, fire-brigade station, market-
- 20 place, and other buildings for municipal purposes, and it is expedient that they should be empowered so to do:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

Short Title.

Council may erect town hall and other buildings.

Schedule.

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Dunedin Town Hall Site Act, 1877."

Clause 2 erased.

2. The parcel of land described in the Second Schedule hereto shall on the passing of this Act vest in the Corporation of the City of Dunedin and its successers in trust as a site for a town hall, fire brigade station, market place, and municipal buildings.

3. 2. It shall be lawful for the Council of the City of Dunedin to erect upon the said-last-mentioned parcel of land [described in the Schedule to this Act], or any part thereof, a town hall, and also a 10 building for a fire-brigade station, a market-place, and such other buildings for municipal purposes as to the said Council shall seem meet: [Provided that the remainder of said land shall be used solely for market purposes.]

Clause 4 erased.

4. It shall be lawful for the Council to let by way of lease any buildings for the time being on the said parcel of land described in the Second Schedule, in the manner, upon the terms and conditions, and with the exceptions specified in the one hundred and seventy-seventh section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876:" Provided that no lease shall be for a longer term than three years.

Bounded towards the North-north-west by Moray Place, four hundred and twenty-six and sixty-two hundredths (126 $\frac{4}{3}$) links; towards the Southwest by Sections numbered respectively twenty-five (25) and thirty-seven (37) on the said plan of Dunedin, five hundred and eight and seventy-two hundredths (508 $\frac{4}{3}$) links; towards the South-south-east by the Octagon, two hundred and thirty-one and intery-four hundredths (231 $\frac{4}{3}$) links; and towards the East-north-cast by other parts of the said Reserve numbered one (1), four hundred and seventy (470) links.
