A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable the City of Dunedin to deal with the Surplus Profits of its Waterworks Account. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Dunedin Waterworks Account Act, 1894.” Short Title.

2. In the interpretation hereof, “the City of Dunedin,” and “Dunedin,” shall mean the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Dunedin, as incorporated by law under that name or the name of the City of Dunedin; and the said “waterworks” shall mean the property, and the rights appertaining thereto, belonging to the said city known as the Dunedin Waterworks; and the “Waterworks Account,” and “the said account” shall mean the separate account which the Council of the said city is obliged by law to keep of water-rates, water-supply, and moneys accruing from waterworks. Interpretation.

3. After making due provision for all sums with which the said account is by law charged, the Council of the said city is hereby empowered to transfer any surplus remaining in the said account to the credit of the General Account. Power to deal with surplus.
