EDUCATION AMENDMENT (NO. 2) BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill amends the principal Act to provide for short "cooling-off" suspensions for pupils.

Clause 1 relates to the Short Title.

Clause 2 repeals section 130 of the principal Act, which deals with the suspension and expulsion of pupils, and substitutes a new Part comprising 7 new sections dealing with the same matters in greater detail.

Section 130 provides that the Principal of a State primary school or secondary school may suspend a pupil from attendance at the school for misconduct or disobedience, or if his continued attendance seems likely to be harmful to himself or other pupils. If the pupil has not previously been suspended during the school year the Principal may, if he wishes, authorise the pupil to return after a "cooling-off" period not exceeding 3 days.

Section 130A provides that a Principal who suspends a pupil must immediately notify his parents, the School Committee or Committee of Management, and the Board or governing body, of the circumstances and duration of the suspension.

Section 130B applies to a pupil authorised to return after a specified period of suspension. The parents or guardians of such a pupil may require the Principal to discuss the suspension with them, and in that event a School Inspector may be present and take part in the discussion. The pupil may be reinstated before the expiration of the period specified.

Section 130c deals with the suspension of pupils who have not attained the age of 15 years and who have not been authorised to return after any specified period.

Subsection (1) provides that if such a pupil turns 15 while suspended, he is thereafter to be dealt with pursuant to section 130p.

Subsection (2) empowers the Board or governing body to lift the suspension of such a pupil, subject to conditions if it thinks fit, or to extend it until some future date.

Subsection (3) provides that if the suspension of such a pupil is not lifted or extended within 7 days, it is deemed to be lifted.

Subsection (4) provides for the further extension by the Board or governing body of the suspension of such a pupil.

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Subsection (5) provides that if the suspension of such a pupil is extended for any reason other than to allow for the completion of inquiries, the appropriate Regional Superintendent of Education is forthwith to be informed.

Subsection (6) requires a Regional Superintendent of Education who is informed of the suspension of such a pupil to endeavour to establish him at some suitable school (which may be the school from which he was suspended).

Subsection (7) requires a Regional Superintendent of Education who has not been able to establish such a pupil in a suitable school to notify the Director-General, who may require the pupil to be enrolled in a correspondence school.

Subsection (8) provides that the name of every such pupil is to remain on the register until he is enrolled at some other school, granted exemption from enrolment at any school, or expelled.

Section 1300 deals with the suspension of pupils who have attained the age of 15 years and who have not been authorised to return after any specified period. Such a pupil must either be reinstated, conditionally or unconditionally, or expelled. Until he is reinstated, leaves school, enrols at another school, turns 20, or is expelled, the name of such a pupil must remain on the school register.

Section 130E allows a Board or governing body to delegate to a member or committee of members its powers under sections 130E to 130E, subject to reversal or modification at its next meeting.

Section 130r deals with the expulsion from private schools of pupils under 15. The Principal or head teacher who expels or suspends such a pupil from a private school must notify the local Education Board. Except in the case of a suspended pupil who is within a reasonable time reinstated, the Board must attempt to arrange for the pupil to enrol at some other school that he may conveniently attend. If it is not possible for the pupil so to be enrolled, the Director-General must be informed, and he may require the pupil to be enrolled in a correspondence school.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Education Act 1964

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Education Amendment Act (No. 2) 1976, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education Act 1964* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 10 2. New Part IVA—(1) The principal Act is hereby amended by repealing section 130, and substituting the following Part:

"PART IVA

"Suspension and Expulsion of Pupils

"130. Suspension of pupils—(1) The Principal of a State primary school or secondary school may, in accordance with this Part of this Act, suspend any pupil from attendance at the school.

"(2) No pupil shall be suspended from attendance at a

school unless, in the opinion of the Principal,-

"(a) By reason of his gross misconduct or incorrigible disobedience, the pupil is an injurious or dangerous 10 example to other pupils attending the school; or "(b) The continued attendance of the pupil at the school

is likely to have a seriously detrimental effect on

himself or other pupils.

"(3) At the time he suspends a pupil from attendance 15 at a school pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, a Principal may authorise the pupil to return to the school after the expiration of a specified period of suspension not exceeding 3 days; and after the expiration of that period of suspension the pupil may resume attendance at the school: 20

"Provided that where a pupil is suspended from a school for a second or subsequent time in one school year the

Principal shall not so authorise the pupil.

"(4) The period of suspension of a pupil authorised to return to a school after the expiration of a specified period 25 of days shall be calculated so as to exclude the day on which he was suspended, and any day on which he would not be required to attend the school even if not suspended.

"(5) Notwithstanding any other provision in this Act (other than subsection (6) of this section), for so long as a 30 pupil is suspended from attendance at a school he shall be

neither required nor permitted to attend it.

"(6) Notwithstanding subsection (5) of this section, for the purposes of section 193A of this Act, a pupil suspended from attendance at a school under this Part of this Act whose name 35 remains on the register of that school shall be deemed to continue to attend that school:

"Provided that the duty of the Principal of the school to give guidance and counselling to the pupil shall be limited to the giving of such guidance and counselling as may, in the 40 opinion of the Principal, be reasonable and practicable in

the circumstances.

"130A. Notification of suspension—A Principal who suspends a pupil from attendance at a school shall immediately, by the most rapid practicable means open to him,—

"(a) Except in the case of a pupil who has attained the age of 20 years, notify the parents or guardian of the pupil of the circumstances and, if he has authorised the pupil to return to the school after the expiration of a specified period of suspension pursuant to section 130 (3) of this Act, the duration of the suspension:

"(b) Notify the School Committee or Committee of Management (if any) of the circumstances and, if he has authorised the pupil to return to the school after the expiration of a specified period of suspension pursuant to section 130 (3) of this Act, the

duration of the suspension:

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"(c) Forward to the Board or governing body of the school a full report on the circumstances and, if he has authorised the pupil to return to the school after the expiration of a specified period of suspension pursuant to section 130 (3) of this Act, the duration of the suspension.

"130B. Suspension for specified period—(1) This section applies to a pupil suspended from attendance at a school who has been authorised to return to the school after a specified period of suspension pursuant to section 130 (3) of this Act.

"(2) The parents or guardian of such a pupil may, at any time after the suspension, request a meeting with the 30 Principal to discuss it; and the Principal shall at the earliest practicable time after the making of the request make himself available for that purpose:

"Provided that the Principal shall not be obliged to make himself available to meet the pupil's parents on more than

35 one occasion in respect of one suspension.

"(3) An Inspector of Schools nominated by the Director-General may be present, and shall be entitled to speak, at any meeting held pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

"(4) The suspension of such a pupil may, at any time 40 before the pupil is authorised to resume attendance at the school, be lifted by the Principal, or by the Board or governing body of the school.

"130c. Suspension of pupil under 15 for unspecified period—(1) This section applies to a pupil suspended from attendance at a school who has not attained the age of 15 years and to whom section 130B of this Act does not apply:

"Provided that a pupil to whom this section applies who while suspended from attendance at a school attains the age of 15 years shall thereafter be dealt with pursuant to section 130p of this Act and this section shall cease to apply to him.

"(2) After considering the report forwarded to it pursuant 10 to section 130A of this Act concerning a pupil to whom this section applies, and making such inquiries as it thinks fit the Board or governing body may lift the suspension, subject to such conditions (if any) as it thinks fit, or may extend it until such date as it thinks fit.

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"(3) If, after the expiration of 7 days from the date of the suspension from attendance at school of a pupil to whom this section applies, the Board or governing body of that school has neither lifted nor extended the suspension, the suspension shall be deemed to have been lifted.

"(4) Any suspension from attendance at a school extended pursuant to subsection (2) of this section shall continue in force accordingly and may from time to time, while in force, be further extended in the same manner.

"(5) If the suspension from attendance at a school of a 25 pupil to whom this section applies is extended pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, the Board or governing body concerned, or member or committee thereof, as the case may be, shall forthwith advise the appropriate Regional Superintendent of Education. 30

(6) Upon being informed pursuant to subsection (5) of this section of the suspension of a pupil, the Regional Superintendent of Education shall endeavour to have the pupil re-established at some suitable school that he can conveniently attend:

"Provided that the pupil shall not be re-established at the school from which he was suspended without the agreement of its Board or governing body.

"(7) If the Regional Superintendent of Education is unable to establish a suspended pupil in a suitable school 40 he shall so inform the Director-General who may require the pupil to be enrolled in a correspondence school established under this Act.

"(8) The name of every pupil to whom this section applies shall remain on the register of the school until he has been enrolled at some other school or a correspondence school, or granted by the Director-General exemption from the 5 obligation to be enrolled as a pupil of any school, or until, after having attained the age of 15 years, he is expelled or leaves school.

"130D. Suspension of pupil over 15 for unspecified period—(1) This section applies to a pupil who is suspended 10 from attendance at a school and to whom neither section 130B

nor section 130c of this Act applies.

"(2) The Board or governing body of the school concerned may, in the light of the matters contained in the report forwarded to it pursuant to section 130A of this Act, and after such consultation as it thinks fit with the District Senior Inspectors of secondary schools and social workers of the Department of Social Welfare, direct that a pupil to whom this section applies be either reinstated (unconditionally or subject to such conditions as it thinks fit to impose) or expelled; and the pupil shall be reinstated or expelled accordingly.

"(3) Until he is reinstated, leaves school, enrols at another school, attains the age of 20 years, or is expelled, whichever may be the soonest, a pupil to whom this section applies shall continue to be suspended from attendance at the school from attendance at which he was suspended, but his name shall

remain on the register of the school.

"130E. Delegation of powers of Boards and governing bodies—Any Board or governing body of a school may by resolution delegate to a member or committee of members all or any of its powers under sections 130B, 130c, and 130D of this Act; and the exercise of any such power by any such member or committee shall be deemed to be its exercise by the Board or governing body:

"Provided that the Board or governing body may by resolu-

"Provided that the Board or governing body may by resolution at its next meeting reverse or modify the exercise of any such power by such a member or committee; and the exercise as so reversed or modified shall take effect from the date of

the resolution.

- "130F. Suspension or expulsion of pupils from private schools—(1) Immediately after the suspension from attendance at or expulsion from a private school of any pupil who has not attained the age of 15 years, the Principal or head teacher shall notify the Education Board of the district in 5 which the school is situated of the suspension or expulsion and the circumstances that led to it.
- "(2) Except in the case of a pupil suspended from attendance at a school who is within a reasonable time reinstated, upon so being notified the Education Board shall 10 either arrange for the pupil to be enrolled at some other school that he may conveniently attend, or notify the Director-General that it has not been able to do so.
- "(3) If the Director-General, having so been notified, is satisfied that the pupil cannot be enrolled at any other school 15 that he may conveniently attend, he may require that the pupil be enrolled with a correspondence school established under this Act"
