A BILL INTITULED

An Act to make Better Provision for the Election of Members of Title. Education Boards.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Education Boards Short Title. Election Act, 1897"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Education Act, 1877" (hereinafter called "the principal 10 Act").

2. The members of the Education Board of each Education Boards to be elected district constituted under the principal Act shall hereafter be elected under this Act.

4. For the purpose of every election the Secretary of the Board Returning Officer. shall be the Returning Officer.

5. In the case of every ordinary vacancy the election shall be Date of election for 20 held on the fourth Monday in May, and the first ordinary election ordinary vacancy. shall be held on the fourth Monday in May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

6. In the case of every extraordinary vacancy the election shall In case of extrabe held on a date to be fixed by the Board, being not sooner than the ordinary vacancy.

Procedure with respect to elections.

7. With respect to every election, the following provisions shall apply:—

(1.) Not later than twenty-one days before the date of the election, the Returning Officer shall, by advertisement published in a newspaper circulating in the district, notify the number of vacancies, and the date on which the election will be held.

(2.) No person shall be eligible as a candidate for election unless he is nominated in writing by at least two electors, and the nomination paper, bearing the candidate's consent in 10 writing, is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed.

(3.) Nominations shall close at five o'clock on the afternoon of the fourteenth day before the date of the election.

Duties of Returning Officer.

8. Not later than the tenth day before the date of the election 15 the Returning Officer shall notify in manner aforesaid,—

(1.) The number of members to be elected;

(2.) The full name of every duly nominated candidate; and

(3.) The day on which the elections will be held, and hour at which the poll will be closed;

and shall also forward to the Chairman of each School Committee in the district a sufficient supply of voting-papers for the use of such of the electors as are members of that Committee.

Mode of voting.

9. The elector shall indicate his vote by drawing a line through the name of all the candidates for whom he does not desire to vote, 25 and shall then sign the voting-paper, and post or deliver the same to the Returning Officer in a closed envelope bearing on the outside thereof the words "Voting Paper."

When voting-paper to be returned.

10. The voting-paper, if delivered to the Returning Officer, shall be delivered at the office of the Board before the day of the election, or 30 not later than five o'clock in the afternoon on the day of the election, and if posted to him, shall be posted to him not later than on that day.

When poll to close.

11. The poll shall close at five o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election; but all voting-papers shall be included and counted which are received by him in ordinary course of post before 35 the close of the tenth day after the day of the election, and are enclosed in envelopes bearing the post-mark of a day not being later than the day of the election.

Informal votingpapers. 12. A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases:—

(1.) If it is not duly signed by the elector.

(2.) If the candidates whose names are left uncancelled exceed the total number to be elected.

(3.) If the elector votes more than once at the same election.

(4.) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, it is not delivered 45 before the close of the poll.

(5.) If, being posted to the Returning Officer, it does not reach him before the close of the tenth day after the day of the election, or if the envelope containing it does not bear the post-mark of the day of the election or of a previous day.

13. On the eleventh day after the day of the election the Returning Officer, in the presence of a Scrutineer to be appointed by

Returning Officer to count votes and declare candidates elected.

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the Board, shall open and examine all the voting-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected) who have received the 5 greatest number of votes, and shall, by notice exhibited in the office of the Board, declare such candidates to be elected.

14. If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more Casting vote. candidates the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall

complete the election by lot in such manner as the Board directs. 15. Forthwith after the completion of the election, the Return-Notification of 10 ing Officer shall notify in the Gazette, and also by advertisement in a result of election. newspaper published in the district, the names of the persons elected, the number of valid votes recorded for each candidate, the total number of valid votes recorded, and the total number of votes 15 rejected as informal.

16. If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of Magistrate to any election, such dispute or question shall be determined by a determined by a determined by a Stipendiary Magistrate in manner provided by "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," all the provisions of which shall, mutatis 20 mutandis, apply in so far as the same are applicable.

17. Nomination-papers and voting-papers for the purposes of Form of nominationthis Act shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

18. The members elected at the ordinary annual election, as when members to hereinbefore provided, shall take office on the second Monday in June take office. 25 following the day of election.

19. The members who, under the provisions of the principal Present members Act, would retire from office on the thirty-first day of March, continued in office. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, shall continue in office until the second Monday in June, one thousand eight hundred 30 and ninety-eight, on which date they shall retire from office.

20. At every meeting of an Education Board at which the Election of Chairman is to be elected, the Secretary of the Board shall preside for the purposes of such election, but shall not vote, and, in the event of an equality of voting, he shall determine the election by lot in 35 such manner as the Board directs.

21. The Governor in Council may from time to time make such Regulations. regulations as he thinks fit in order to give full effect to the purposes of this Act.

22. The principal Act is hereby modified in so far as it conflicts Education Act with this Act, but not further or otherwise.
