A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for Secrecy of Voting at Elections of Education Title. Boards.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Education Boards Short Title. Election Act, 1901"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Education Boards Election Act, 1900" (hereinafter

10 referred to as "the principal Act").

2. (1.) At every election of a member of an Education Board the Declaration of Returning Officer and every scrutineer shall, before entering on their secrecy. respective duties, make and sign the declaration set forth in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) The declaration may be made and signed before a Justice 15of the Peace, or the Chairman of the Board, or, in the case of a scrutineer, before the Returning Officer.

(3.) Every such declaration shall be exempt from stamp duty.

3. Every Returning Officer or scrutineer who makes known the Disclosure of certain

20 state of the poll, or gives or pretends to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known, before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or who makes known for which candidate any voter has voted, commits an offence, and is liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding fi/ty pounds.

New Clauses.

- 1A. (1.) Not later than thirty-eight days before the date of the Procedure with 25election the Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, notify the number of vacancies, the date on which nominations will close, and the date on which the election will be held.
- (2.) Nominations shall close at five o'clock on the afternoon of 30the twenty-second day before the date of the election.

(3.) No person shall be eligible as a candidate for election unless he is nominated in writing by at least two electors, and the nomination-paper, bearing the candidate's consent in writing, is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed.

1B. Not later than the seventeenth day before the date of the 5 election the Returning Officer shall notify in manner aforesaid—

(1.) The number of members to be elected;

(2.) The full name of every duly nominated candidate; and

(3.) The day on which the elections will be held, and hour at which the poll will be closed; 10

and shall also forward to the Chairman of each School Committee in the district a sufficient supply of voting-papers for the use of such of the electors as are members of that Committee.

1c. The two *last preceding* sections are in substitution for sections seven and eight of the principal Act, which sections are 15 hereby accordingly repealed.

4. (1.) In the case of every extraordinary vacancy the election shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Board, being not later than the *fiftieth* day after the vacancy occurs.

(2.) This section is in substitution for section six of the principal 20 Act, which section is hereby accordingly repealed.
