A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to confer Additional Powers upon the Ellesmere Domain Board. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Ellesmere Domain Board Empowering Act, 1909. Short Title.

2. The Ellesmere Domain Board may, out of funds at its disposal derived from the domain under its control, purchase in the name of His Most Gracious Majesty the King one or more piece or pieces of land for public recreation purposes for the Township of Southbridge and the Township or Village of Doyleston, or at the discretion of the Board, for either of such places, excluding the other of them. such townships or villages, situated within the Ellesmere Road District, as the Domain Board in its discretion may hereafter from time to time decide. Power to purchase land for recreation purposes.

3. Subject to the provisions of section two hereof, the Board may from time to time, out of the funds and in the manner prescribed in such section, acquire one or more piece or pieces of land for public recreation purposes for such township or townships, village or villages, situated in the district served by the Board, as the Board in its discretion may hereafter from time to time decide. Power to purchase land from time to time for recreation purposes.

4. All land purchased by the Board under the provisions of this Act shall, on being conveyed to the King, be subject to the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, and shall be under the control of the Ellesmere Domain Board. Land purchased subject to the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908.
