A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to define the Hours of Labour within the Colony of New Zealand. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Eight Hours Act, 1889." Short Title.
- 2. From and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, eight hours shall constitute a day's work, and forty-eight hours a week's work. Eight hours a day's work, and forty-eight hours a week's work.
