A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to continue the Operation of certain Expiring Enactments Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows :-

1. This Act may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Short Title. Act, 1921–22.

2. (1.) The enactments mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall Duration of certain expiring enactments. continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen 10 hundred and *twenty-two*, and shall then expire unless further

continued.

(2.) The Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1921, shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and no longer.

3. Section two of the Acts Interpretation Amendment Act, 1920, Section 2 of Acts 15 is hereby revived as from the date of the expiry thereof, and shall Interpretation Amendment Act, continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen 1920, revived. hundred and twenty-two, and shall then expire unless further continued.

4. Section four of the Sale of Liquor Restriction Act, 1917, is Limiting duration 20 hereby amended by omitting from subsection thirteen the words of awards under "for the duration of this Act," and substituting the words "until Liquor Restriction the first day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-two." All Act, 1917, such awards having been awards and agreements made under or consequent upon the said Act extended without
