A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to continue the Operation of certain Expiring Enactments Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1921-22. Short Title.

2. (1.) The enactments mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and *twenty-two*, and shall then expire unless further continued. Duration of certain expiring enactments

(2.) The Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1921, shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and *twenty-two*, and no longer.

3. Section two of the Acts Interpretation Amendment Act, 1920, is hereby revived as from the date of the expiry thereof, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and *twenty-two*, and shall then expire unless further continued. Section 2 of Acts Interpretation Amendment Act, 1920, revived.

4. Section four of the Sale of Liquor Restriction Act, 1917, is hereby amended by omitting from subsection thirteen the words "for the duration of this Act," and substituting the words "until the first day of February, nineteen hundred and *twenty-two*." All awards and agreements made under or consequent upon the said Act and subsisting at the commencement of this Act shall be construed as if any reference therein to the duration of the said Act were a reference to the period ending on the said first day of February, nineteen hundred and *twenty-two*. Limiting duration of awards under section 4 of Sale of Liquor Restriction Act, 1917, such awards having been extended without agreement of parties by reason of extension of duration of Act.
