A BILL INTITULED

An Act to enable Education Reserves to be administered under Title the Village-settlement System.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Education Reserves short Title.

Administration Act, 1887."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section two hundred Village settlements and thirty-seven of "The Land Act, 1885," when and so often as he on education reserves. 10 may deem it expedient that any education reserve or any part of an education reserve shall be utilized for the purposes of a villagesettlement the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare that, upon the expiry of any then existing lease or tenure, such reserve or part of a reserve shall be subject to the provisions of sections 15 one hundred and sixty-six and one hundred and sixty-seven of the said Act; and such Proclamation shall thereupon have full force and effect, and shall not depend upon the request or recommendation of the body or person in whom such reserve is vested.

3. Every lease granted in respect of any land subject to such How leases to be 20 Proclamation shall be executed in the name of the body or person in executed and rents applied. whom the reserve is vested; and all rents received by the Receiver of Land Revenue under such leases shall by him, on receipt thereof,

be paid over to such body or person.
