EMERGENCY REGULATIONS AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill extends the duration of the remaining emergency regulations for a further year, that is, to the end of 1961.

The only regulations that are to remain in force are the Finance Emergency Regulations 1940 (No. 2) and the amendments of those regulations and a revocation order, which is continued in force because of savings provisions therein.

A BILL INTITULED

Title

An Act to amend the Emergency Regulations Act 1939

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1960, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Emergency Regulations Act 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. Emergency regulations continued in force—The emergency regulations specified in the Schedule to this Act, unless they are sooner revoked by the Governor-General in Council or by any Act, shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, and shall then 15 expire.
 - 3. Repeal—The Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1959 is hereby repealed.
