EDUCATION RESERVES (No. 2).

ANALYSIS.

Title.  
1. Short Title.

2. School Commissioners may sell or exchange small or isolated sections of land on reserves.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Education Reserves Act, 1877."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Education Reserves Act, 1905 (No. 2)"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Education Reserves Act, 1877."

Short Title.

2. It shall be lawful for the School Commissioners, with the consent of the Minister in each case, to sell or exchange town sections and isolated rural sections vested in such Commissioners which, in the opinion of the Commissioners and the Minister, cannot be leased to advantage; but in case of a sale the moneys received shall, as soon as is convenient, be invested in the purchase of freehold land to be held by the Commissioners for educational purposes.

School Commissioners may sell or exchange small or isolated sections of land on reserves.
