Where any fence is required to be erected on land covered with standing bush, and the notices required in "The Fencing Act, 1881," have been given, the person erecting such fence shall be entitled to clear the bush for a width not exceeding thirty-three feet on each side along the entire length of such fence, and may fell any tree standing in the immediate line of such fence; and the cost of such clearing shall be added to the cost of the erection of such fence, and be apportioned accordingly.</p> <p>3.
