FENCING ACT 1881 AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Fencing Act, 1881."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Fencing Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1888." Short Title.

2. A fence of the kind described in the Schedule hereto shall be a sufficient fence within the meaning of "The Fencing Act, 1881," as if it had been included in the descriptions enumerated in Schedule A to such Act. Sufficient fence.

But no such fence shall be erected within the limits of any borough or town district.

SCHEDULE.

DESCRIPTION OF FENCE.

A FENCE of four-barbed wires or three-barbed wires and two plain wires tightly stretched, with in either case posts of durable wood or iron standards; the posts or standards not to be more than twelve feet apart; the top wire not to be less than four nor more than five feet from the surface of the ground. The space between each of the barbed wires to be, as far as practicable, equal.
