FENCING ACT AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Fencing Act, 1895."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Fencing Act Amendment Act, 1896." Short Title.

2. A fence of the following description shall, within the County of Westland, but not elsewhere, be deemed to be a sufficient non-rabbit-proof fence within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Fencing Act, 1895," that is to say,— Additional sufficient non-rabbit-proof fence for Westland County.

A substantial post-and-wire or standard-and-wire fence, having not less than three barbed wires tightly stretched and securely fixed to the posts or standards, the posts or standards being not more than twelve feet apart.

15 3. The provisions of the appendix marked "A" to "The Impounding Act, 1884," shall, in their operation within the County of Westland, be read and construed as if the words "or unfenced" were omitted therefrom. Impounding in Westland limited to fenced lands.
