A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Family Allowances Act, 1926. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority 5 of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Family Allowances Short Title Amendment Act, 1936, and shall be read together with and and deemed part of the Family Allowances Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have come into force 10 on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-six.

2. (1) Application for an allowance under the Mother of principal Act may be made either by the father or by the mother of the children to whom the application 15 relates.

(2) Section three of the principal Act is hereby under consequentially amended by omitting the word principal Act. "father", and substituting the word "parent".

(3) References in the principal Act to the wife of an applicant shall, in cases where application for an allowance is made by the mother of any children, be read as references to the applicant, or to the husband of the applicant, as the context may, in the opinion of the Commissioner, require.

Section 12 of principal Act amended. 3. (1) Section three of the principal Act, as amended by section twenty-six of the National Expenditure Adjustment Act, 1932, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "three pounds five shillings", and 10 substituting the words "four pounds".

(2) Section twenty-six of the National Expenditure Adjustment Act, 1932, is hereby consequentially repealed.

4. Section twelve of the principal Act is hereby 15 amended by inserting, after the word "solicitor", the words "Minister of Religion".
