A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to Fencing.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Fencing Amendment Act, 1902"; and it shall form part of and be read with "The Fencing Act, 1895" (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

Short Title.

2. Every covenant or agreement made or entered into between any owners of adjoining lands for the purpose of modifying or varying the rights and liabilities conferred or imposed on them by the principal Act shall run with the land whether assigns be named therein or not, and shall be deemed to create an "interest in land" within the meaning of "The Land Transfer Act, 1885."
