ANALYSIS.

Title. 1. Short Title. 2. Special licenses may be issued in respect of fishing in part of Rotorua Acclimatization

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Fisheries Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Fisheries Amendment Act, 1926, Short Title and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries Act, 1908.

2. (1.) The power to make regulations with respect to fishing for special licenses 10 trout and perch conferred on the Governor-General in Council by may be issued in sections eighty-three and ninety-four of the Fisheries Act, 1908, is hereby part of Rotorua extended to enable him to make regulations providing for the issue of Acclimatization District. special licenses to fish for trout and perch in the rivers, streams, and lakes of the Rotorua Acclimatization District (other than those included 15 in the Taupo waters as defined by section twenty-nine of the Native

Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1924), or in any one or more of such rivers, streams, and lakes, but in no other part of New Zealand, and prescribing fees to be paid in respect of such licenses.

(2.) While any such regulations are in force no license purporting to 20 be available throughout New Zealand shall entitle the holder thereof to fish for trout or perch in any waters to which such regulations apply.
