(2) For the purpose of ensuring compliance with the requirements of any such regulations, any person authorized in that behalf by the Controller and Auditor-General may enter upon the premises of any acclimatization society and there inspect any books or papers belonging to or in the possession of the society.

(3) All moneys paid into the Consolidated Fund pursuant to this section shall be applied in defraying expenses incurred by direction of the Minister of Marine for research in relation to fresh-water fisheries, and 10 expenditure incidental to such research.

(4) Section ninety-four of the principal Act is hereby amended by repealing paragraph (e) thereof.
