A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Better Inspection of Factories.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in
Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-
5 lows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Factories Inspection
Act, 1885." Short Title.

It shall be read together with "The Employment of Females
and Others Act, 1881" (hereafter called "the said Act.")

10 2. The occupier of every factory, his agents and servants, shall
furnish the means required by any person authorized as provided in
section eleven of the said Act (herein referred to as "an Inspector")
as necessary for an entry, inspection, examination, inquiry, or the
exercise of his powers under the said Act in relation to such factory.

15 3. Every person who refuses, prevents, or wilfully delays the
entry of an Inspector into a factory, or in any way obstructs an
Inspector in the exercise of any power under the said Act and this
Act, or who conceals or prevents a child, young person, or female
from appearing before or being examined by an Inspector, or attempts
20 so to conceal or prevent a child, young person, or female, shall be
liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding *ten* pounds,
to be recovered in a summary way under "The Justices of the Peace
Act, 1882."
