BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Fugitive Offenders short Title. 15Jurisdiction Act, 1883."

2. Every Resident Magistrate shall have and may exercise the Resident Magistrate jurisdiction conferred under Part One of the said Act to hear a case to ender whether a said act to hear a case to under Part I. and commit a fugitive to prison to await his return in the manner of the Act of the Imperial Parliament Ω prescribed by the said Act.
