A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Gaming Amendment Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Gaming Amendment Act, 1914, and shall form part of and be read together with the Gaming Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. (1.) The Minister of Internal Affairs may, on the application of any racing, trotting, or hunt club not being the holder of a totalizator license, grant to that club a licence to use the totalizator on one day.

One-day totalizator licenses.

(2.) Not more than thirty licenses may be granted under this section in any year, and of that number not more than seventeen shall be granted to racing clubs, nor ten to hunt clubs, nor three to trotting clubs.

(3.) Licenses may be granted under this section notwithstanding that thereby the total number of days on which the totalizator may be used exceeds the number prescribed by section six of the Gaming Amendment Act, 1910.
