A BILL INTITULED

An Act to provide for reimbursing Members of the General Assembly Title. their Expenses in relation to their Attendance at Parliament.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The General Assembly Mem-Short Title. bers' Expenses Act, 1883," and shall come into operation on the first day of the next session of the General Assembly.

Interpretation.

2. In this Act, to Ishariaha yan ro

"Member" means a member of the Legislative Council or the

House of Representatives, as the case may be:

"Sitting day," where used in relation to the Legislative Council or the members thereof, or to the House of Representatives or the members thereof, means every day on which such Legislative Council or House of Representatives respectively shall, during any session, be, by their Standing Orders, appointed to sit for the transaction of business.

3. There shall be paid out of the Consolidated Fund to every Allowances to member of the General Assembly, for every session at which he attends, members of the

To every member of the Legislative Council residing beyond ten miles from the building wherein the General As-

sembly is summoned to meet One hundred and five pounds.

To every member of the House of Representatives Two hundred and ten pounds. Subject, nevertheless, to the following provisions:

(1.) If during any session any member shall absent himself on any sitting day from attending Parliament, there shall be deducted for every such day one pound and ten shillings from the allowance to be made to a member of the Legislative Council, and three pounds from the allowance to be made to a member of the House of Representatives.

(2.) The preceding provision as to the deduction to be made in the case of absence of any member in attendance on Parliament shall not apply where such absence is caused by reason of illness, or from any other cause which shall, by 10 the Speaker of the House giving the certificate hereinafter mentioned, be therein stated to be unavoidable.

avelling allowance.

(3.) In addition to the allowance aforesaid, there shall be paid to every member the actual sums which such member shall have reasonably paid in proceeding to and returning from 15 the place of meeting of the General Assembly: Provided that such payment shall be made only in respect of one journey to and from such place.

o payments to be ade without peaker's certificate. (4.) No payment shall be made to any member except upon the certificate of the Speaker of the House of which the person 20 claiming such payment shall be a member.

(5.) Payments on account of such allowance may be made from time to time not exceeding one pound to a member of the Legislative Council, and not exceeding two pounds to a member of the House of Representatives, for each sitting 25

day on which any member has been present.

4. No payment under this Act shall be made to any member in respect of any session or in respect of any part of any session during which such member—

(1.) Holds any one or more of the ministerial offices mentioned 30 in the Third Schedule to "The Civil List Act 1863 Amendment Act, 1873," or any ministerial office that may by law be substituted for or added to the offices mentioned in such Schedule;

(2.) Is Speaker of the Legislative Council or of the House of 35 Representatives respectively;

(3.) Or is Chairman of Committees of the said Council or of the House of Representatives respectively.
